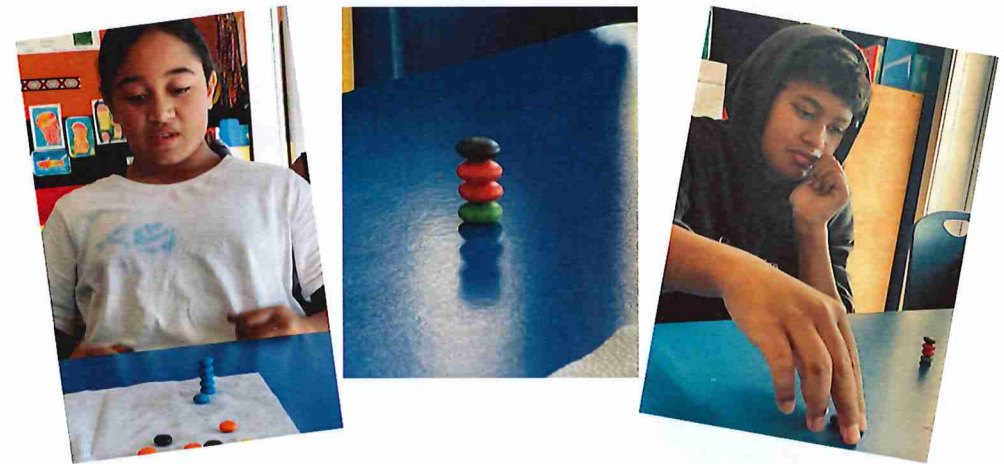
SIGNIFICANT TERM THREE DATES TO ADD TO YOUR CALENDAR
