It has been great to see our tamariki return to school happy, recharged and ready to go this term! We look forward to another busy, fun-filled term that will take us out of winter and into spring.

TIMETABLE CHANGE TO MAXIMISE LEARNING TIME

This term we have made a couple of changes to our timetable which have created an extra twenty minutes of in-class learning time. This might sound insignificant but it does make a big difference. To do this we have shortened the lunch play time. We are also trialling a 'play first, eat second' model at lunchtime. There are multiple reasons for this, the first being that many students, boys in particular, just want to get out and play when lunchtime begins and will forgo food in order to do so. They often return to class hungry and unsettled because they haven't eaten. The 'play first, eat second' model enables our tamariki to get out and play and then get some food in their stomachs before the last learning block begins.

Secondly, eating after play also enables students to unwind and reset, particularly if there has been a 'friendly disagreement' out on the rugby field or in the playground. Eating second gives students time to chill out, relax, eat and reconnect with their teacher before returning to class.

Thirdly, we have been exploring ways to reduce the amount of food waste from school lunches and are interested to find out if our students will eat more after they have had a good run around. We will wait and see.

To confirm, our break times are: 10:10am - 10:30am: *Morning Tea* 12:15pm - 12:45pm: *Lunch Play;* 12:45pm - 1:00pm: *Lunch Eat*
